Winnipeg Grain Prices
 WHEAT, Oct. 4.—(P)—Wheat pit trading consisted mainly of spreading operations on Winnipeg Grain Exchange today and prices moved narrowly to close 1/2 cent lower, with the October future at 70 1/2, December 71 1/2 and May at 70.

Chicago was unchanged while Buenos Aires was 1/2 cent lower at noon.

The cash wheat market dealers reported a good demand for No. 2 Northern and the lower grades. Spreads were generally unchanged.

Local spreading operations occupied most traders in the coarse grain pit. Shippers purchased some oats and domestic interests supported barley.

Last week's Argentine shipments totalled 1,054,000 bushels compared with 1,400,000 bushels the previous week and 1,853,000 bushels during the same week last year.

Western farmers delivered 2,152,000 bushels of wheat to country elevators yesterday compared with 3,608,000 bushels on the same day last year.

LONDON

A cheque for £100 (\$445) has been received by the Royal Air Force comforts committee from Ronald Colman, British film star. Writing from California, Colman asked especially that his gift be devoted to the purchase of cigarettes and tobacco for the men of the R.A.F. "in gratitude."

LONDON—Lieut. Henri Deterding, son of the late oil king, Sir Henri Deterding, is a prisoner of war, the admiralty informed his wife at her Daventry home today. Lieut. Deterding previously was reported missing while on active service with the fleet air arm.

LONDON—A foreign office spokesman, in a first guarded official comment on the possible results of the visit of the Spanish minister of the interior, Ramon Serrano Suner, to the axis powers, said today that the situation "does not look unhelpful" from the British point of view.

LONDON—The King made a tour of London air raid shelters during a German raid this afternoon. He talked with scores taking refuge in the shelters while Nazi warplanes dived overhead.

LONDON—The King received new members of the government at Buckingham Palace today and then attended a meeting of the Privy Council.

ROME—Roman restaurants were forbidden today to serve butter, either separately, in sandwiches or in any other form. In Milan, charges were brought against 697 merchants accused of profiteering on foodstuffs.

VENICE, Italy.—A group of boys who made "parachute troops" out of cats and launched them from the tops of buildings, tied to umbrellas, were sought today by officials of the Humane Society.

LONDON.—The engineer of a passenger train turned on full speed to escape a German bomber which attacked his train with machine-gun and incendiary bombs today in Detering previously was reported derailed. The train reached the next station undamaged.

VICHY, France.—The Pétain-Laval government today appointed Maj.-Gen. O. L. T. Piquandier to be chief of staff of the army, succeeding Lt.-Gen. L. F. Caillaud, who retired from active service.

MOSCOW.—The United States lacks both arms and troops, the Soviet army organ "Red Star" said today in a review of recent U.S. military manoeuvres. Training of personnel is the weakest spot in the U.S. army, it added.

BERLIN—British bombers made 1,471 flights over German territory during September and dropped exactly 7,542 bombs, authorized German sources said. They admitted
